



CAREER DEVELOPMENT GRANTS FOR ARTISTS

Supporting Artists

For over 30 years, the Prince Edward County Arts Council has had the privilege of **supporting professional events** that showcase the work of Ontarian artists. Our events annually generate upwards of \$250,000 in sales of art.

Today we are expanding our **support of local artists** by offering career development **grants** through the **Artist Fund**, a new initiative that, since its launch in 2017, has awarded \$5,300 to local artists.

With a one-time injection of funds from the Ontario Arts Council, we were able to kickoff the Artist Fund, but **require community support** to help grow the program in 2019 and beyond.

The Artist Fund offers an ideal channel for businesses wishing to invest in the arts, a sector that drives **innovation** and **economic growth**.

Who is Eligible

Our membership is a diverse group of artists including painters, makers, photographers, illustrators, cinematographers, authors, designers, performers, and more! Emerging and professional artists may apply to the Fund's various programs.

To be eligible, applicants must meet the following:

- Have a permanent physical address in Prince Edward County.
- Be an Artist Member of the Prince Edward County Arts Council.

Applications are deemed eligible by the Executive Director and then evaluated by Board Members guided by the Arts Council's evaluation criteria. Applicants are eligible to receive funding once per calendar year. There must not be any outstanding reports due at the time that the application is received.

What are the obligations of successful candidates?

- Grant Acknowledgement Form must be signed.
- Public acknowledgement of the Arts Council's support.
- Final Report must be submitted within 30 days of the project's completion.

Programs

The Artist Fund supports the following programs:

Professional Development (\$1500)

Strengthen artist careers through learning.

Market Development (\$1500)

Support artists as they develop new markets for their work.

Public Art (\$1500)

Encourage the realization of public art projects in the community.

Artists in the Community (2020 launch – \$TBD)

Help the community engage professional artists to realize art-focused projects, or help artists to realize projects that engage residents.


Successful Candidates 2017
